WRITE-UP ABOUT THE AUGUST RALLY FROM RALLY HOSTS

The August 2019 rally will be held August 15 - 18 at Riverbend Campground in Hiawassee, Ga. Please make your reservation ASAP and be sure to tell them you are with the

Georgia Funseekers when you make your reservation. The hosts are Dave and Pam Schumacher and co-hosts are Bill and Ellen Guettler.

The rally fee is \$15 per person, or \$30 per couple, and a check should be mailed to Dave Schumacher at 1070 Treadstone Lane, Powder Springs, GA 30127, at your earliest convenience.

The following is a proposed schedule for the weekend:

Thursday: This is not normally a set day as part of our usual rallies, but the campground will furnish a fish fry for our group that night, and our group will furnish French fries, coleslaw, and corn on the cob to go with the fish and hushpuppies. I believe the time will be 5:30 p.m.

Friday: No group activity has been scheduled for during the day, but here is a list of some spots to visit on your own: Lake Chatuge; Bell Mountain; Hamilton Gardens at Lake Chatuge; High Shoals Falls; Brasstown Bald; and ArtWorks Artisan Center.

Friday p.m. — We are planning on going to dinner at **5:30 p.m.** at Brother's At Willow Ranch located at 6223 Highway 76 West, Young Harris, GA 30582. This is an American cuisine, and can accommodate vegetarian. In order to book the banquet room, we will need to know ASAP if you will be joining us. Back at the clubhouse after dinner, games of different kinds to be played.

Saturday 9:00 a.m. — Breakfast at the clubhouse. Biscuits, sausage gravy, hard-boiled eggs, fresh fruit, coffee, and juice will be served. <u>Please bring your own plates, bowls,</u> utensils and cups.

Saturday afternoon — We have been notified that David Goldhagen, the glassblower artist that we had originally planned to visit, will not be at his studio on the weekend that we will be in Hiawassee. For those interested, however, his gallery will be open to view his work and make any purchases. We are now planning to visit the John C. Campbell Folk School located at 1 Folk School Road, Brasstown, NC 28902, which is about 30 minutes' drive from the campground up U.S. Route 64.

The school was founded in 1945 to nurture and preserve the folk arts of the Appalachian Mountains and was listed on the National Register of Historic Places as a national historic district in 1983. The Folk School has week-long and weekend classes year-round in traditional and contemporary arts. We will meet on Saturday, August 17th, at 2:30 at the Craft Shop and

can split into groups of 5-7 people to visit the classes being held, which includes basketry, blacksmithing, woodcarving, weaving, and spinning wheel, as well as several others. Some of you may decide to sign up for a class in the future!

Saturday 5:30 p.m. — We will meet at the clubhouse for grilled chicken patties, oven-roasted potatoes, mixed stir-fry vegetables, dinner rolls, and iced tea. Dessert will be birthday cake and ice cream to celebrate August birthdays, including Dave Schumacher! <u>Please bring your plates, utensils, and cups.</u> After the meal, we will be playing Yahtzee.

Sunday 9:00 a.m. – Breakfast at the clubhouse, different kinds of biscuits from local restaurant, fresh fruit, coffee, and juice. <u>Please bring your own plates, utensils and cups.</u>
