And The Winners Are...



Newsletter Editor's Ramble Bob Erickson



Last month was a HUGE month for content in the newsletter! Rally report, meeting minutes, President's message, National Director's Report... This month there is not much. So, I'm going to reprint some earlier Rally Reports. This will remind folks of the fun we've had in the past. The first is the Loretta Lynn Ranch, and the second is from one of my favorite rallies in Birmingham AL.

Separately from this newsletter, but included as a separate attachment, is a letter from an FMCA member about FMCAAssist. I would like to add that the Good Sam Club family TravelAssist package (optional) is currently on special for \$80 (regular and renewal price \$101).

Here is a picture of my porch, as completed. I've been writing about this for months, and it has nothing to do with RV'ing except taking our time away from it!



Water System Internal Leak

I sanitized my water system this month, and I flush with city water from the faucet instead of from the tank. As a last step, I fill the fresh tank to 1/3 full. I turned the fill valve from "City" to "Fill", and fresh tank immediately overflowed. I turned off the valve and let some out from the tank drain. Leaving the valve in "City" position, the tank overflowed in less than an hour. This did not happen at the September rally...



OBVIOUSLY, the inlet valve that switches between pressurizing the plumbing lines and filling the tank is internally leaking.

The fresh tank was full, so I had put the hose away. To confirm my diagnosis days later; I hooked up the regulator and hose, made sure the valve was in the "City" position, and turned on the water. I have a clear view of my fresh tank, and have a cap so I can fill my tank with a hose. The fill line comes in at the top of the tank. I used a flashlight to view the inlet to the tank. While I was looking, there was a belch of air from the bottom of the tank!



So, the OTHER way this can happen is through the water pump, if an internal check valve is leaking. The belch of air from the citywater hose that had air in it proves this diagnosis.

My pump is a Shurflo 4008 Revolution pump. The pressure switch is in the front center.



Removing the 3 screws removes the switch, and under that is the check valve.



Above is the check valve replacement kit, available for about \$11. I haven't installed it yet, the pump photo is from my old (broken) pump.

Using an RV Travler Satellite Antenna for House

The DirecTV installers would only install my antenna on the roof of the house. Since then, a tree has grown (more), and light rain or a breeze pixelates our TV picture. I want to move the dish to the ground, and thought that I could use the RV dish (with the DVR in the house) during the process. I've been unsuccessful so far (it should work). I'll tell you how when I'm successful.

As far as I know, only 3 families have registered for the October rally. I called on 9/14, and the assistant manager answering the phone said she had no way of identifying our club members. As far as I know, only Caruthers, Wicars, and Ericksons have signed up. Honeycomb did say that all waterfront sites are taken. I tried to tell everyone that Caruthers rallies are the best-the theme (most hosts don't have themes) is Halloween.

I would like to mention that hosts have latitude to select rally locations and dates. ..
