New pickup truck has 300,000 pound towing capacity

(Nov. 6, 2019) — Tesla watchers have been breathlessly



hunting for clues about the company's long-anticipated electric "Cybertruck." The anticipation may soon be over.

Today, Tesla CEO Elon Musk announced on Twitter

that the long-anticipated pickup truck will be unveiled on November 21 near the SpaceX rocket factory in the port of Los Angeles. "It's gonna be awesome, it's gonna be amazing. This will be heart-stopping. It stops my heart. It's going to look like it came off a movie set." Musk said recently.

Little is known about the truck now, but Musk once described it as a massive 6-seater with an option for anywhere between 400 and 500 miles of range, packing a monstrous 300,000 pound towing capacity (that is not a misprint). For the non-mathematicians in the crowd, that's 150 tons!

By comparison, the 2019 Ram 1500 has a towing capacity of 12,750 pounds. But that's nothing according to Musk when compared to his new pickup.

Musk has made similar statements before. This comment in a blog about the new truck read: "Does anybody think that a Tesla truck will have the ability to take even 3,000 pounds of payload? Because it's not just whether the thing has enough torque to get the load moving — you need enough brakes to stop it. You need enough suspension to manage the ride. You need enough weight to keep the trailer from wagging the tow vehicle."

The Tesla Truck's official unveiling could be scheduled for 2020 at the earliest.

No RV sites at this campground — just "glampers" for \$149 to \$514 a night

Not a week passes without a few new campgrounds being built or proposed across America. But increasingly many of those campgrounds do not accept RVs. They're "glampgrounds." The latest is a Montana-based luxury campsite operator that is making its first venture east of the Mississippi River with a proposal to build its ninth "glamping" site close to Acadia National Park in Maine.



Under Canvas of Bozeman, Montana, has submitted a proposal to build a seasonal, luxury camping resort on a 101acre former hay farm on Route 172 that the company agreed to buy if

the project is approved. The move to build the glamping site — with tents that have king-size beds, luxe linens, bathrooms and wood-burning stoves — is part of a national expansion for the company to complement existing resorts near National Park Service sites including the Grand Canyon and Mount Rushmore. The tents are far more luxurious than what you'd expect in a normal campground.

Want to stay? It'll cost you between \$149 and \$514 a night. The company plans to open with 75 tent sites and add more later, said Rachel Zembraski, a company spokeswoman.

Do you know your Cabela's history?

Many RVers have taken advantage of the "RV welcome mat" extended by Cabela's sporting goods stores. Many of the retailer's parking lots have dump stations, some of them even for free use. And taking a hike through Cabela's is like visiting a giant "man cave." If you're into the outdoors, you need to go



into Cabela's – it's like being outside, while inside.

of how Cabela's came to be? It all started with co-founder Dick Cabela. "Dick, along with his wife, Mary, and brother, Jim, founded Cabela's somewhat inadvertently in 1961 when he purchased \$45 worth of hand-tied fishing flies while in Chicago on a furniture and housewares buying trip with his father for the family's Chappell, Nebraska furniture store," says a news release.

Apparently Dick found furniture easier to sell than fishing gear, because when those fishing flies didn't "fly off the shelf," Cabela tried a different approach. He put an ad in a Casper, Wyoming, newspaper selling his gear by mail – and drew exactly one sale. Not ready to throw in the sinker, a new advertisement in Sports Afield magazine read, "FREE introductory offer!!! 5 popular Grade A hand-tied flies. Send 25c for postage and handling." That advert worked like a magnet and orders poured in. Cabela quickly saw the light and ordered more gear. He and his wife put out a "catalog" consisting of three mimeographed pages, which he added to every order he sent out.

So much for tables, chairs and sofas. Dick's original \$45 worth of fishing tackle was eventually transformed into a \$3.6 billion company with a huge, colorful, glossy paper catalog and an Internet presence known around the world.

On Dick Cabela's death in 2014, a company announcement read, "Outdoorsmen and women have lost a true friend, a man who improved their lot by putting them first, by working to



provide what they wanted and needed for their hunting and fishing adventures. He pushed for research

and development in every outdoor field. Dick always looked out for the customer and if he couldn't find a vendor to provide what he wanted, he pushed Cabela's to design and make it. Because of that passion, the Cabela's brand and its products are iconic throughout the world."
