Ten (10) Travel Safety Tips and How NOT to Become a Victim of Crime

1. Trust your Gut

- Neuropeptide Signaling is real
- Knowing things before we know them, even if we can't explain how
- We are "wired" for self-protection
- Trust your inner voice

2. NEVER Walk Alone in the Dark

- 3. Always Make Eye Contact with Those You Pass Along the Way
 - One with evil intent may be dissuaded if they know you've seen them
 - Make note of height, weight, hair color/style, scars or tattoos

4. Inform Family/Friends of Your Plans

- Share trip detail
- Check in with them ofte
- NOT on social media

5. Social Media Posts

- CAUTION: Posting timely and accurately can alert others to when you're away from your RV
- Keep social media shares vague
- Avoid using exact locations
- Share photos and videos after you've left that area

6. Carry Identification

- Campground details/know your site #
- Health Information
- · Labels for pets and children's clothing

7. Keep Your keys with You

- Keys can be weapons
- Key FOB's are personal alarms
- On your person or by your bed
- Don't leave spare keys behind in RV

8. Tricks to Deter

9. Keep Your Phone Close

Take It EVERYWHERE

- If you Fall
- If you get lost
- If you need emergency help
- Take photos of anything out of place

- Law enforcement can track your location
- 10. Be Aware of Your Surroundings
 - Note where you park
 - Take photos with your phone
 - Notice things that don't look right
 - Be aware of odd behavior
 - Stay alert at rest stops and gas stations

Three Options for Person Protection

- Personal Alarms
 - Battery Operated
 - o Scares off human predators
 - Works on wild animals too
 - Can even alert someone if you've fallen
- Firearms
 - o Know the state laws where you live/travel
 - Nonlethal Weapons
 - Pepper gas-filled balls
 - o Plastic or rubber slugs
 - o No Permit needed
 - No recoil or loud bang
 - Allowed in check bags
